



- We are brothers and sisters in a fraternal communion of faith and love that needs to be nurtured by mutual prayer, by common spirituality and knowledge, by assiduous attendance.
- Assiduous: def. showing great care and perseverance.



It is in fraternity that we get our FORMATION

- Prayer, discussion and collaboration among members should lead to dynamic gatherings and then to apostolic activities. (Const. 53.3)
- Fraternity is the basic unit of the whole order, a visible sign of the Church, a community of love. (Art. 22)

- The sense of co-responsibility of the members requires
 - Personal Presence
 - Witness
 - Prayer
 - Active Collaboration in accordance with each one's situations for the animation of the fraternity (const. 30.2)




- “The term ‘**Penance**’ in Franciscanism is equivalent to the Biblical meaning of Metanoia, understood as an intimate conversion of the mind and heart to God, as a vital attitude, a continuous state of being penitent.”
