#### Minister's Message

May 27, 2023

Greetings to you, Juan de Padilla region! Memorial Day is a day to honor those who have served in the U.S. military. I was thinking of those who I know who have served. What courage and humility it must have taken to choose to join the military and possibly be called to lay down their life for another. I think of St. Francis, and in his early years he desired to be a knight and to lay down his life. He became a prisoner and became ill. He had several experiences and eventually experienced a conversion in his life and began to live in a different way. Through his love for God, he humbly served the poor, the sick, and the marginalized. He lived a life of voluntary poverty, going so far as to strip naked in the city square and return all the clothes he had in his possession to his father so that no worldly riches distracted him from this mission. He preached the Gospel through this sacrificial love.

St. Francis opened his heart to the Lord and did so in humility, trust, and surrender. We are called as OFS to follow St. Francis' way of life. We get to choose to empty ourselves of all worldly attachments and pursue this holy way of life. Sometimes our Lord and Savior allows a stripping of our own worldly attachments and it can cause us grief. This "stripping away" can be very painful and force us to adjust or make a change in life. If we empty ourselves, and remain faithful by surrendering and acceptance, suffering humiliations and trusting in Divine

Providence, we have room to be filled with grace and virtue to grow in holiness. I invite you to ask yourself what are you holding onto that needs "stripped" away? What takes up space in your heart, mind, or life that could be emptied to make room for a filling of grace and maybe more peace?

In a few short days June 9 - 11, 2023 we will be together at the Spiritual Life Center in Wichita for the 2023 Summer Gathering. I am looking forward to seeing many of you there. Fr. Curtis Carlson OFM Cap will be speaking on the Sacraments. It is a great time to build fraternal bonds with our OFS brothers and sisters.

The REC continues to meet on a regular monthly basis. We had originally planned to have Chapter October 13 and 14 but after reviewing the budget and realizing that next year and the following year we will have bigger expenses due to a National Visitation in 2024 and Elections in 2025, we will be meeting only on October 14 to save the budget. ### **FOLLOW ME**

In the last verses of John's gospel, Jesus says twice to Peter, "Follow Me". The first time is after Jesus hints to Peter how he will die and the second time is when Peter shows too much concern with what John, the beloved, will be doing. Jesus responds with, "What does it matter to you? You are to follow Me." These two words are so simple and yet Christ repeated them throughout his ministry to the Apostles, thirteen times in the Gospels. St. Francis clearly heard the words of Jesus as St. Bonaventure tells us in his writings.

One day as he was praying in solitude, Jesus Christ appeared to him, hanging on his Cross. He made Francis realize so vividly the force of the Gospel words, "If any man has a mind to come my way, let him renounce self, and take up his cross, and follow me (Mt 16:24) that his heart was filled with compassion and burned within him with the fire of love" (Bonaventure, Minor Life Chap.1, Lesson 4).

John's Gospel shows us exactly what we must do to fulfill the request Jesus asks of us Franciscans and that is to not take our eyes off of Christ. We are able to carry our cross and follow Christ only if we keep our eyes on Christ himself, who leads us. If we look to the left or right to see what our neighbor is doing as Peter did when he concerned himself with John, we will lose sight of Christ. Once when Francis was ill someone offered to read a book of devotions to him, and Francis responded, "My book is Jesus crucified" (St. Alphonsus Liguori - The Practice of the Love of Jesus Christ, p.11). So let us follow St. Francis who faithfully followed our Lord and did not concern himself with the world and its ways but chose only to see Jesus Christ crucified.

so that I may carry out Your holy and true command.




## St. Anthony's Fraternity Continues to Grow in Wichita, KS

# Astonishing News: Mother Mary Wilhelmina, First African American Found Intact in Gower, Missouri!

Bishop Robert Finn brought a group of traditional Latin Rite nuns to pray and sacrifice for the priests of the diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, MO in 2006. The order grew quickly with new vocations coming daily. The sisters are known world-wide for their beautiful Gregorian chants and music, exquisite traditional Latin Mass vestments and art. They raise farm animals, garden and work long hours of rural life.

Sr. Wilhelmina, foundress of the order, died on May 29, 2019 at the age of 95. She was buried along side the graves of miscarriage children.

This spring, her body was to be placed inside the church as the foundress of the order. When they opened her simple pine casket, her body, which had not been embalmed, was still intact! One of the nuns said that her habit looked better than her own. Sister will be encased in glass on May 29th, 2023.

Sister Josephine Boyes OSF wore her "Birthday Princess" sash as she celebrated her 91st birthday with flowers, lunch and chocolate cake.



Queen of the Angels members have planted 450 plants at the Stations of the Cross on the ground. They plan to assist in teaching the woman to can produce from the gardens this summer.





### The Franciscan Journey of Peace and Justice

(Last weekend 20 OFS JPIC animators met at the Mercy Retreat Center in St. Louis. The format was that of a retreat; lots of work was done in small groups. We spent our time on reflecting on the new mission our OFS NEC chose at the last chapter held in Detroit last fall: "Listen, discern, go forth!)

#### LISTEN

Secular Franciscans are meant to be bearers of peace and perfect joy, and to act as salt and light in our communities. We are New Testament Christians, and particularly called to live The Beatitudes, engaging in good works and giving glory to God. Listening is essential to this process. We need to ask ourselves, and fraternity members, these essential questions: What am I being led to be and do? How can I best carry out the Gospel message in the fraternity, and in my community?

We then need to be quiet and listen carefully to how we respond. A precondition to this process is to respect each other and be open to the views of others. Listening should be non-judgmental. Ideally, we should set aside our own agenda and the retort "we've always done it this way." This is an opportunity for new thinking.

Many participants in the retreat noted that we should make use of the new electronic technology as much as we can. This includes using Zoom or similar tools to conduct meetings (i.e., continuing to hold hybrid meetings), and for communication between meetings. To facilitate such sessions, fraternities may wish to consider upgrading their technology by using Owl cameras and speakers, for example. It is also a good time to assist some members who are technology-challenged.

After hearing and sharing about each of the elements—listen, discern, go forth—in our small groups, we dialogued on some questions: What are the impediments to each element? (Noise? Distractions? People?) How can I as a Secular Franciscan respond to and help eliminate the impediments that were identified?

#### DISCERN

Henri Houwen noted that discernment is not a straightforward process. It involves listening and responding to the place within us where our deepest desires align with God's desires. We need to consider what our charism is and how best to use it. We should ask ourselves: Why did God call me to be a Franciscan? Am I making an effort to live a Gospel life? Prayer is an important part of this process. We should ask the Holy Spirit to show us where we need to go.

#### **GO FORTH**

The going forth process is outwardly oriented. We are expected to carry our Gospel values into the wider community. We have access to people and places that the clergy rarely go. To start, we need to be open to new ideas. We can also show individual and group initiative. A fraternity member might say: "I'm going to do this; would anyone like to join me?" Members of the retreat pointed out there are various social change roles:

- Helpers involving direct service, volunteering in charities
- Advocates working inside the system, attempting reforms, helping others navigate the system; social workers and attorneys
- Organizers planning, directing activities outside/alternative to the system
- Rebels speaking truth to power; public protest and direct action (I would also say that this person is bold; not afraid of speaking or writing the truth.)

Fraternities and individuals should use the discernment process to guide individual fraternity members to consider which one of these categories they most comfortably fit in. There is no "one size fits all." We must ask ourselves: What apostolates/activities/missions/advocacy are the we most drawn to?

The JPIC Manual on the national website can provide guidance and suggestions on program ideas. Really, the sky is the limit. We need to consider what we can most effectively bring to the community where we live.

Finally, in the loving community that our fraternity is expected to be, let us remember: "Encourage each other every day while it is still today" (Hebrew 3:13).

So I invite fraternities, guided by your appointed JPIC animator or your vice-minister to use the process of listening, discerning and going forth as a process to help you evaluate what you've been doing in your apostolate for your community and to assist you in moving forward, more intentionally focused and more clear about the gifts that each fraternity member brings to the table. And please, do this with a spirit of joy, This is meant to be a tool for growth and discovery! Joy opens our hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit!

And so together, let us listen, discern and go forth!


