Advent 2024

Come, Lord Jesus, Come.

At National Chapter in Scottsdale AZ September 17-22 at the Franciscan Renewal Center, in Father's homily the first night he stated, "We say Come Holy Spirit! It's dangerous. Tomorrow you will say Come Holy Spirit and then put Him back in a cage. The Holy Spirit may change your plans or ideas."

"When we come to Chapter, we try to attune ourselves to the voice of God. Father said when in Times Square listen for the cricket. Do you think you could hear it? If someone dropped a coin, many people would turn and look where the coins fell. What do you attune your ear to? If you have peace in your heart you can attune to the voice of God."

St. Francis is no longer the minister of the chapter, the Holy Spirit is. This Order is not ours. You don't have to prove anything to anybody. Ask yourself, "Do I really want to be transformed by Christ? The body will suffer. We will change if we allow God in."

Here are some things that came out of Chapter:

- The Initial Formation Materials are being piloted by the **National Formation Team**, it is called, **Let Us Begin** and it starts after the Welcoming
- Additional Servant Leadership workshops are being held National elections will be held September 13, 2025 at National Chapter
- JPIC Animator's retreat May 8-11, 2025 at Holy Cross Retreat center, Las Cruces, NM
- Aspirants are no longer considered Inquirers

On Spiritual Assistance:

- The Spiritual Assistance Handbook is being revised
- Formation of SA's can be done by correspondence.
- There is no set period of time for the SA program. Fr. Jerome Wolbert completes his SA trainees in one year if the material is covered.
- The Provincial can tell whoever they want to do the forming.
- Regions can collaborate together for SA formation.
- The Conference of National Spiritual Assistants have no intention of creating a national program.
- Definite: It can not be: SA to their own fraternity at any level.

On Deactivation of a fraternity:

- Has to be a pastoral and fraternal visit and a report. Canon Law have 100 years to resurrect the fraternity.
- Funds have to be spent before deactivation OR go to the region, then put in escrow for 100 years. The fraternity can vote to give the funds to the region.
- Document, archive records, deactivated fraternity put in archives and buy boxes to put the records in.
- Copy of Letter to the Bishop about deactivating

If a candidate can't profess - their candidacy ends there. NEC is coming up with a term for this.

On Visitation and Elections:

- Nominating Committee 6 9 months before you get started. Minimum of 2 names per position
- Review Office requirements so all know and understand. Do one month at a time.
- · Provide to the Presider -
- Regional guidelines
- Slate of nominees and their contact info 2 months before the election
- Audit of treasurer records complete
- Time of gathering
- Election results
- Check and Update guidelines after election of new council.

- On the national website under Resources/suggested schedule for a regional visit.
- The presider needs 2-3 hours with local ministers
- SA's will meet with someone

Fraternal Accompaniment

Discussed at International Chapter. Still waiting for the English Translation

The National Budget was changed to give \$1000 to the JPIC Award Recipient for travel, room and board to receive the award at the National Chapter, in addition to the \$3000 cash award.

Fair Share - responsible for paying for all active, excused, and candidates to national.

The Power and Strength of the Gospels



In these present times, as it was with Francis, there is war and division within the world. There is confusion in society and family's, and that includes our church. Francis was called by Christ to serve the Master and rebuild His church. This is true for every brother and sister of our Franciscan Family. Whether in the time of St. Francis or now in the present, Christ has called us to follow Him, as Francis did and we do that by living the Gospels because the world of God has the power to change the world.

When Francis spoke to the many people who gathered to hear him, he spoke with God's authority. Whether it was crowds of people he spoke to or hundreds of his brothers or maybe just a few friars, Francis taught what he himself had learned from the gospels. (Rule 7)

There is a story of Francis preaching in the town of Bologna where most of the townspeople came to hear the saint preach. Wearing his worn habit and looking unkept, Francis talked of peace in the community.

"But God conferred so much power on his words that they brought back peace in many a seignorial family torn apart until then by old, cruel and furious hatreds even to the point of assassinations. The people showed him as much respect as they did devotion." (Omnibus, c.1983, p. 1601)

The powerful words used by Francis to change hearts and bring peace to the town of Bologna were not his own. Only by the power of God's word and the Holy Spirit was Francis able to convert whole towns and the family's in them to peace and forgiveness. That same power and strength given to Francis is also given to us Franciscans. St. Paul reminds us, "There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength." (Phil. 4:13 TJB) We cannot underestimate the power of the Gospels or God's strength in us for our own daily conversion and others.

In the book of Hebrews it reads, "The Word of God is something alive and active; it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely: it can slip through the place where the soul is divided from the spirit, or joints from the marrow; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts." (Hebrews 4:12) That is **how powerful the scriptures are and why it is so important for us to read and study the gospels** just as Francis encouraged his brothers to do the same. Once when a New Testament was given to the brothers, Saint Francis divided it up and gave each brother a page for them to study without interruption. That is how important it was to Francis for his brothers to know the gospels. **We need to daily spend time reading the gospels to be able to speak the words of Christ as Francis did.** We have to read scripture and pray scripture and share scripture. Then we will be fulfilling our vow, going from Gospel to Life and Life to Gospel. (Rule 4)






St Joseph Fraternity Hays, KS




New Ritual Book








The New Revised Ritual Book and Online Gospel to Life Bookstore

At this writing, we have just entered Advent, the liturgical season during which we wait for the birth of the Christ-Child Jesus. At that time Israel was waiting for the coming of their Messiah.

Anyone who has ever waited for a long time for anything knows how energy waiting can consume. We feel anxious; we plead with God to hurry; we get bone-tired of waiting; sometimes our commitment to our faith may falter.
